Human trafficking is the forced exploitation of someone for labor or sex and is a serious problem in Kentucky. Human trafficking oppresses adults and children of all races, genders, ages, occupations, and backgrounds. Help Kentuckians break free from this injustice by watching for the signs of human trafficking. A person may be a victim of human trafficking if they are being controlled by another person, nervous to talk to outsiders or authorities, avoiding eye contact, malnourished, showing signs of physical abuse, or do not have a form of identification. If you see any of these signs or believe someone is a victim of human trafficking, call 911 immediately. Remember, your eyes can save Kentucky lives.
